The Buffalo County Board of Supervisors and the Buffalo County Board of Equalization met on Tuesday, November 25, 2014 at 9:00 and 10:15 A.M. Chairman McMullen called the meeting to order and led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance. The following Board members responded to roll call: Francis Biehl, Joseph Brayton, Kent Greder, Ivan Klein, Sherry Morrow, Dennis Reiter and William McMullen. A copy of the acknowledgment and receipt of notice and agenda by the Board of Supervisors is attached to these minutes. Chairman McMullen announced that in accordance with Section 84-1412 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes, a current copy of the Open Meetings Act is available for review. County Clerk Janice Giffin took all proceedings hereinafter shown; while the convened meeting was open to the public. County Attorney Shawn Eatherton was present.

**REGULAR AGENDA**

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Reiter to approve the November 10, 2014 Board meeting minutes. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Brayton, Reiter, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Morrow and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Klein to accept the County Treasurer October 2014 Fund Balance Report. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

The UNK Criminal Justice Club presented a recognition plaque to the County Board that will hang in the Law Enforcement Center. The Criminal Justice Club wanted to recognize the K9 Unit that serves Buffalo County and the City of Kearney. Criminal Justice Club members, Amy Trausch, Brad Ward, Shelby Troester, Taylor Knuth and their advisor Dr Jhi were present. Sheriff Neil Miller, Deputy Robert Tubbs and Deputy Paul Cox were also present.

**COURTHOUSE RENOVATIONS**

Project Manager Steve Gaasch from Beckenhauer Construction was present to update the Board on the Phases 4-7 Courthouse Renovation Project. Moved by Morrow and seconded by Klein to approve Change Order request #81 of the Phase 4-7 Alterations in the credit amount of \$38,289.20 for unused General Conditions, Fee and Contingency fund. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried. Gaasch submitted the Phase 4-7 Contract Change Order #13 for the Chairman's signature. The Contract Change Order #13 is a compilation of previously approved Change Orders; therefore no action was necessary.

**RESOLUTION 2014-67**

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING CONSERVATION EASEMENT FOR THE CENTRAL PLATTE NATURAL RESOURCES DISTRICT**

WHEREAS, GARY MIKE HUBBARD and MARIAN HUBBARD, husband and wife, are the owners of the following described real estate, to-wit:

A tract of land being part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SE1/4 SE1/4) and part of Government Lots One (1), Two (2) and Three (3) all located in Section Ten (10), Township Eight (8) North, Range Eighteen (18) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows: Referring to the Southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 10 and assuming the East line of said Southeast Quarter as bearing N 01°36'53" W and all bearings contained herein are relative thereto; thence N 01°36'53" W on the aforesaid East line a distance of 291.02 feet to the ACTUAL PLACE OF BEGINNING; thence continuing N 01°36'53" W on the aforesaid course a distance of 433.26 feet; thence N 77°19'40" W a distance of 875.24 feet; thence N 81°32'38" W a distance of 919.3 feet; thence N 82°20'48" W a distance of 677.0 feet; thence N 87°52'51" W a distance of 737.8 feet; thence N 86°06'35" W a distance of 1414.08 feet; thence N 84°00'23" W a distance of 742.86 feet to a point on the West line of said Government Lot 1; thence S 00°19'25" W on the aforesaid West line a distance of 1264.22 feet to the Southwest corner of said Government Lot 1; thence N 85°29'05" E a distance of 3974.63 feet; thence S 85°51'43" E a distance of 1381.8 feet to the place of beginning. WHEREAS, the Central Platte Natural Resources District is desirous of obtaining a conservation easement from GARY MIKE HUBBARD and MARIAN HUBBARD, on real estate legally described hereinabove and GARY MIKE HUBBARD and MARIAN HUBBARD are desirous of selling a conservation easement to the Central Platte Natural Resources District on the real estate legally described hereinabove; and

WHEREAS, Central Platte Natural Resources District and GARY MIKE HUBBARD and MARIAN HUBBARD have submitted a request to Buffalo County for the approval of a conservation easement on the real estate legally described hereinabove; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NEB. REV. STAT. §76-2,112 (2009), on October 28, 2014, the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors forwarded the easement request to the Buffalo County Planning and Zoning Commission for their review and recommendations regarding the conformity of the proposed acquisition to comprehensive planning for the area; and

WHEREAS, also pursuant to NEB. REV. STAT. §76-2,112 (2009) on November 20, 2014, the Buffalo County Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of the easement at their regularly scheduled meeting; and

WHEREAS, this Board on November 25, 2014 conducted a public hearing on the granting of this easement and no parties spoke in disfavor of granting this easement, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors that this Board approves grant of the designated conservation easement on the real estate legally described hereinabove and more specifically set forth in the Deed of Conservation Easement which more particularly describes the property as:

A tract of land being part of the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SE1/4 SE1/4) and part of Government Lots One (1), Two (2) and Three (3) all located in Section Ten (10), Township Eight (8) North, Range Eighteen (18) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Buffalo County, Nebraska, more particularly described as follows: Referring to the Southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter of said Section 10 and assuming the East line of said Southeast Quarter as bearing N 01°36'53" W and all bearings contained herein are relative thereto; thence N 01°36'53" W on the aforesaid East line a distance of 291.02 feet to the ACTUAL PLACE OF BEGINNING; thence continuing N 01°36'53" W on the aforesaid course a distance of 433.26 feet; thence N 77°19'40" W a distance of 875.24 feet; thence N 81°32'38" W a distance of 919.3 feet; thence N 82°20'48" W a distance of 677.0 feet; thence N 87°52'51" W a distance of 737.8 feet; thence N 86°06'35" W a distance of 1414.08 feet; thence N 84°00'23" W a distance of 742.86 feet to a point on the West line of said Government Lot 1; thence S 00°19'25" W on the aforesaid West line a distance of 1264.22 feet to the Southwest corner of said Government Lot 1; thence N 85°29'05" E a distance of 3974.63 feet; thence S 85°51'43" E a distance of 1381.8 feet to the place of beginning. Containing 102.73 acres, more or less.

Together with conditions of the easement and other matters as more particularly described and set forth in the Deed of Conservation Easement which this Board by reference thereto incorporates into this Resolution as if fully set forth herein, should be, and hereby is, approved.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that proponent or proponents of the easement is authorized to file copy of the Resolution against described properties and/or attach a copy of this Resolution to any deed, easement, and/or other document associated with it, should they so desire.

### **RESOLUTION 2014-68**

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 2011-50A, this Board on October 28, 2014, amended an interlocal agreement with Kearney County concerning development of certain real estate described later concerning real estate to be subdivided are referred to as "SUMMER HAVEN SECOND", and

WHEREAS, on November 18, 2014, the Kearney County Board of Supervisors adopted and approved a subdivision and plat for "SUMMER HAVEN SECOND" a subdivision of real estate located in both Buffalo County and Kearney County, described later, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the original and amended inter local agreements previously entered into between Buffalo and Kearney Counties, Buffalo County's zoning regulation does not apply to the real estate described later because in the interlocal agreement, Kearney County's zoning regulation supplanted and replaced Buffalo County's zoning regulation, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County when approving subdivision for SUMMER HAVEN SECOND, described later, is not enforcing Buffalo County's applicable zoning regulations, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County in approving the proposed subdivision is acting only as a political entity approving the subdivision of land based upon the plan of development prescribed by and ceded by agreement to Kearney County,

WHEREAS, this Resolution that approves SUMMER HAVEN SECOND contains the same metes and bounds description as the October 28, 2014, amendment to the inter local agreement and also includes reference, for indexing purposes, to lands in part of SUMMER HAVEN SECOND that are situated in Government Lot Nine (9), in Section Fourteen (14, Township Eight (8), Range Fifteen (15), Buffalo County, Nebraska.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BUFFALO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF BUFFALO COUNTY, NEBRASKA, in regular session with quorum present, by virtue of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement and Compact made between Buffalo County, Nebraska and Kearney County, Nebraska, and passed and approved by the Buffalo County Board of Supervisors by Resolution No. 2011-50A on October 28, 2014, Recorded November 17, 2014, in the Office of the Buffalo County Register of Deeds as Instrument No. 2014-07072; that the plat of "SUMMER HAVEN SECOND", a part of accretion lands deriving from and adjacent to Government Lot Nine (9) in Section Fourteen (14), a part of Government Lot One (1) a subdivision being a part of Government Lot One (1) and part of accretion lands deriving from and adjacent to said Government Lot One (1), with said part of Government Lot 1 and part of accretion lands deriving from and adjacent to said Government Lot 1 in Section Twenty-three (23), being located in Buffalo County, Nebraska, together with, part of Government Lot Three (3) and part of accretion lands deriving from and adjacent to said Government Lot 3 in said Section Twenty-three (23), with said part of Government Lot 3 and part of accretion lands deriving from and adjacent to said Government Lot 3 in Section 23 being located in Kearney County, Nebraska, all in Township Eight (8) North, Range Fifteen (15) West of the Sixth Principal Meridian, duly made out, acknowledged and certified is hereby approved, accepted, ratified and authorized to be filed and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds, Buffalo County, Nebraska.

Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Klein to approve the addition of pledged collateral in the amount of \$2,681,026.00 at First National Bank for the Buffalo County Clerk. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Greder to approve the release of pledged collateral in the amount of \$22,560,000.00 at First National Bank for the Buffalo County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Morrow and seconded by Greder to approve the addition of pledged collateral in the amount of \$495,068.70 at Town and Country Bank for the Buffalo County Treasurer. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Deputy County Attorney Fisk informed the Board that the decision to modify the work week should be tabled until December 9, 2014 in order to work out final details with the time clock system.

Moved by Klein and seconded by Reiter to reappoint Loye Wolfe and to appoint Marc Vacek to the Planning and Zoning Commission for a three year term that will expire on November 30, 2017. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Klein, Reiter, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Morrow and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Weed Superintendent Mitch Huxoll was present for discussion of the change in the custom spraying program. The Weed Committee authorized Huxoll to notify the current customers of this change on October 31, 2014. Moved by Reiter and seconded by

Moved by Brayton and seconded by Morrow to enter into Executive Session to discuss litigation at 9:47 A.M. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Brayton, Morrow, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Greder and seconded by Biehl to move out of Executive Session at 10:10 A.M. and resume the open meeting. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Greder, Biehl, Brayton, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Highway Superintendent Ron Sklenar was present for the following Agenda items.

Moved by Klein and seconded by Brayton to accept the bid from Murphy Tractor in the amount of \$640,145.00 for two new 2015 Motor Graders and a Rubber Tired Front End Loader with the trade in allowance for two motor graders, one loader and one crawler. Moved by Morrow and seconded by Brayton to approve Tax List Corrections numbered 4034 and 4035 submitted by County Assessor Barber. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Morrow, Brayton, Biehl, Greder, Klein, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Biehl and seconded by Greder to approve the renewal Motor Vehicle Tax Exemption as indicated on the application by County Treasurer Sidwell for Christian Heritage Children's Home on a 2005 Chrysler Sport Van and a 2013 Honda Civic. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Biehl, Greder, Brayton, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Klein and seconded by Biehl to approve the renewal Motor Vehicle Tax Exemption as indicated on the application by County Treasurer Sidwell for Goodwill Industries of Greater Nebraska on a 2005 Chevrolet Impala and a 2010 Dodge Grand Caravan. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

Moved by Klein and seconded by Biehl to adjourn the Board of Equalization at 10:22 A.M. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Klein, Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Motion declared carried.

### **REGULAR AGENDA**

Deputy County Attorney Andrew Hoffmeister brought an emergency item to the attention of the County Board to discuss that came up within 24 hours before the Board meeting. County Officials were made aware that Elm Creek Township had listed equipment and property for sale that the County currently co-leases. After discussion and recognizing that this could not wait until the December 9, 2014 Board meeting, it was moved by Biehl and seconded by Brayton to approve the following Resolution 2014-69 that authorizes the County Attorney's office to proceed on behalf of Buffalo County. Upon roll call vote, the following Board members voted "Aye": Biehl, Brayton, Greder, Klein, Morrow, Reiter and McMullen. None voted "Nay". Abstain: Reiter. Motion declared carried.

### **RESOLUTION 2014-69**

WHEREAS, at approximately 4:00 o'clock p.m., yesterday, November 24, 2014, it was brought to the attention of Buffalo County employees that Elm Creek Township and/or its township officials were making efforts to sell various items of personal property, including but not limited to: one 500 gallon fuel tank; one John Deere Rotary Mower, and one John Deere 7410 Tractor, and were furthermore attempting to sell or otherwise dispose of Elm Creek Township's leasehold interest in a machine shop located at or near 715 North Mill Street, in the Village of Elm Creek, Buffalo County, Nebraska on real estate that is owned by the Village of Elm Creek, which said machine shop is co-leased and shared with by Buffalo County, and

WHEREAS, townships are to be dissolved on January 7, 2015, by operation of law following a public vote that directed that Buffalo County's Townships be dissolved, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County has previously expressed to Elm Creek Township officials this County's desire to assume Elm Creek's lease of the machine shop and its desire to purchase items of personal property if the township desired to sell these items prior to the township's dissolution, and

WHEREAS, Buffalo County, should it not succeed in acquiring Elm Creek Township's leasehold interest in the machine shop upon the dissolution of the township, will incur unknown and unnecessary costs to obtain space in which to store highway maintenance equipment and supplies that are needed in the Elm Creek area of Buffalo County, and

WHEREAS, an emergency exists and this Board should immediately take immediate action regarding this information to protect Buffalo County's interests although this subject was not posted on the Buffalo County Agenda for this meeting of this date, and

WHEREAS, this Board needs to act on this information in light of its present needs and authorize that the necessary steps be taken to prevent and stop the sale of these items of property, to set aside any sales if unlawfully done, and/or take all other acts necessary to acquire the above described property.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THIS BOARD, ON BEHALF OF BUFFALO COUNTY, authorizes the Buffalo County Attorney's Office, to instigate, pursue, and do all acts necessary to secure Buffalo County's acquisition of Elm Creek Township's leasehold interest in a machine shed located at located at or near 715 North Mill Street, Elm Creek, Buffalo County, Nebraska, on real estate owned by the Village of Elm Creek. These actions may include, but are not limited to: commencement and prosecution of condemnation proceedings for the acquisition of the named property interest, requesting injunctive relief to prevent any sale of the named property interest, and any other lawful action necessary to accomplish acquisition.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Buffalo County Attorney's Office is authorized to instigate, pursue and do all acts necessary to secure Buffalo County's acquisition of Elm Creek Township's interest in a John Deere Rotary Mower, John Deere 7410 tractor, and 500 gallon fuel tank and any other item of personal property of Elm Creek Township. These actions may include, but are not limited to: commencement and prosecution of condemnation proceedings for the acquisition of the named properties, setting aside any sale and/or other disposition of the items of personal property, requesting injunctive relief to prevent any sale of the named property, and any other lawful action necessary to accomplish acquisition.

Chairman McMullen called for Citizen's forum and no one was present.

Supervisor Morrow excused herself from the Board meeting at 10:45 A.M.
